The Gift of Scripture

In the New Testament we read: "Remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures..." (2 Timothy 3:15).

It is a great gift to be introduced to the Scriptures as a child. Think about how you do this for your own children, helping them to grow in love and knowledge of the Bible from a young age. Pool your wisdom with other parents. Some ideas and links follow.



FAITH STEPS AT HOME

Gather

Display a family bible in a visible, attractive spot in your home. Go to it regularly. Everyone loves a good story, and the Bible is full of them. Encourage Bible storytelling at home. Play 'bible charades'. Watch and discuss together films with biblical themes. Play Christian music with scriptural lyrics. Drop a Scripture verse in your children's lunch box.



Pray

Teach your children to feed themselves not only with food but with the 'daily bread' of Scripture. Include Scripture in your family prayer time.

Remember

Even a single verse of Scripture can inspire and shape our actions.

On *Friday 31 October* all students may wear colourful and fun socks and *bring a gold coin or donate via the QKR App* to support this worthy cause.




